





Higher proportion of OA Sixth Formers go to university than the NI grammar school average.







Achieve at least a grade B or higher in the subject at GCSE (the higher the grade, the better, if a subject is oversubscribed in Year 13)




Have read the details about the subject in the options booklet e.g. Content and assessment


Research

The Options Blocks

- Will be released in late June.
- There may be clashes between subjects that you would like to choose.
- This is unavoidable and will be kept to a minimum BUT <u>the blocks cannot be changed.</u>
- The options blocks are done to best fit the majority of pupil choices.
- Final subject options choices at Post GCSE results day interviews in August.



Remember, if a subject is oversubscribed, pupils will be ranked on their GCSE score and only those with the best scores given the opportunity to study the subject/s.




How many Post 16 subjects can you choose?



All pupils must choose to study 3 subjects



Some choose 4 to keep options open or to 'try and see' before dropping down to 3 at some point in Year 13.



Some do 4 at A.S. Level and then drop down to 3 subjects at A2 Level.

To reinforce -



You can only do 1 subject at SWC (on at the same time)



Be careful about choosing more that 1 BTEC - do your research!
