# Pastoral Care

## Nurturing Potential

**High standards of Pastoral Care pervade all areas of Omagh Academy life.**

We view our pupils' progress holistically. Not merely content with strong academic performance, we ensure that each student feels safe, is cared for and that their emotional needs are supported.

The Pastoral Team, led by Vice Principal Miss Faris, exists to ensure that a warm, caring and safe environment exists within our school.

Each class has a Form Teacher who meets with his/her class every morning. This daily contact allows for detailed knowledge of the academic and wellbeing needs of the pupils and provides guidance and encouragement with opportunities to build good relationships.

The Year Head has overall responsibility for the year group – monitoring attendance, behaviour and academic progress – and is the first point of contact between school and home. The Year Head continues to give pastoral support to their assigned year group throughout their time at Omagh Academy.

## Safeguarding

**Omagh Academy treats safeguarding seriously. We have a suite of pastoral policies which regulate practice and a Safeguarding Team which promotes and implements safeguarding.**

The School Counsellor is present in school every week and is available for any pupil who wishes to make an appointment.

Parents, pupils and Staff are encouraged to download and make use of the Safer Schools App to promote and support safe use of the internet.

## Support

**We want our pupils to thrive, and we seek to provide support to ensure that they reach their potential.**

The school's Learning Support Co-ordinator works in collaboration with pupils, staff, parents and professionals to identify and assess the special needs of pupils. Effective intervention strategies to aid learning are then devised, agreed and shared through the pupil's Personal Learning Plan (PLP). The PLP is regularly reviewed to monitor both the pupil's progress and improve the effectiveness of the support provided.

To promote good learning habits and understanding, we provide Literacy and Numeracy Support. Senior pupils are also involved in a mentoring scheme where they work alongside younger pupils and provide mathematics support. We also ensure that every pupil receives key stage-appropriate training in study skills and approaches to revision

## Pupil Leadership

**The community of students is led by the Head Girl and Head Boy and a Prefect Leadership Team. We value their support and creative input into the running of the school.**

The School Council also provides opportunities for the pupil voice to be heard within school and they advocate for and represent their peers. The Council meets once a month and is made up of representatives from all twenty-eight form classes across the school. Members play an important role in shaping new policies, plus building relationships with Staff and Governors. The Council also takes the lead in promoting core messages about Anti-Bullying and staying safe on the internet in the wider school community. Representatives from the School Council are also members of the Strule Shared Education Student Council which meets termly in a host school.

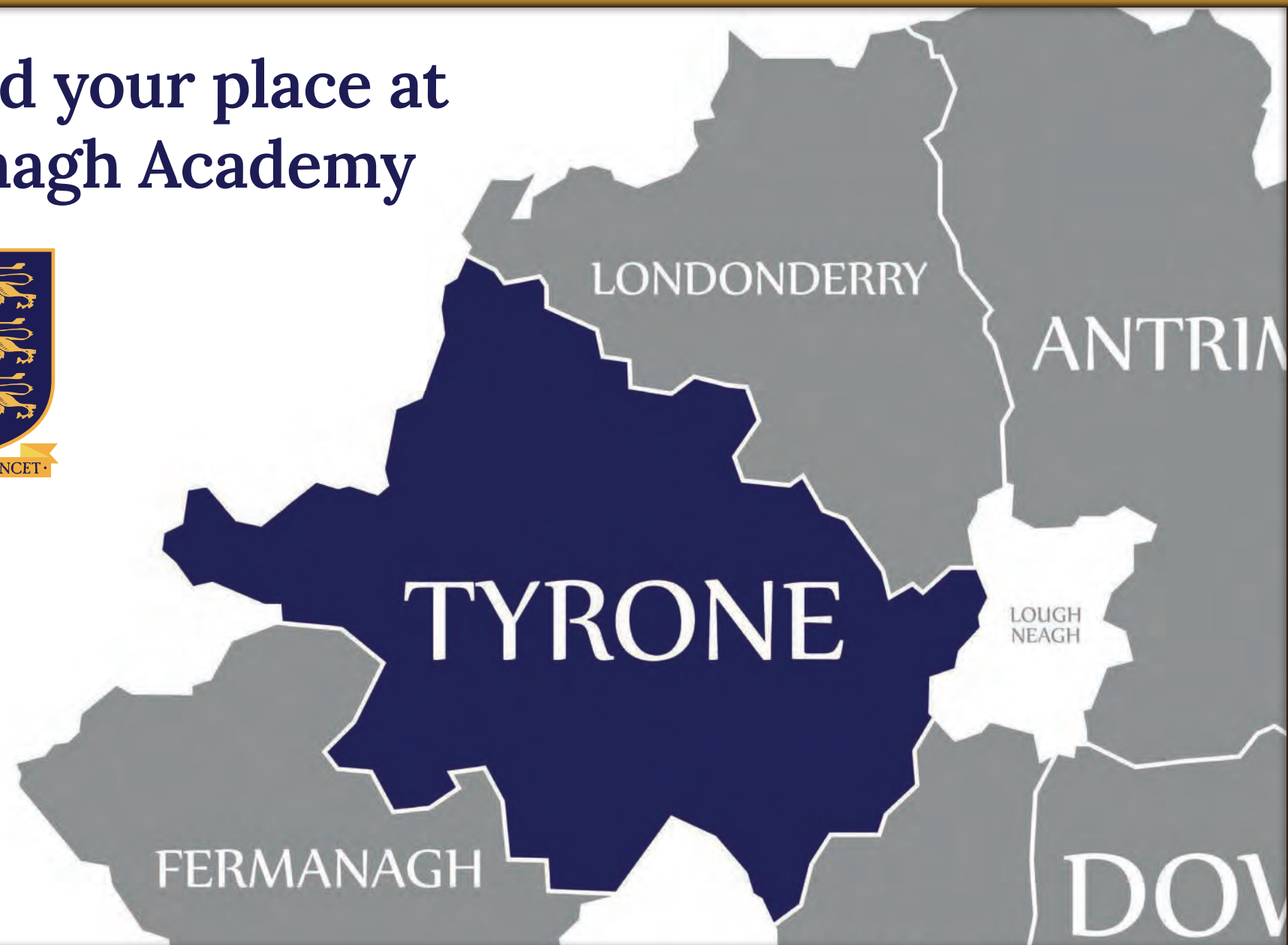

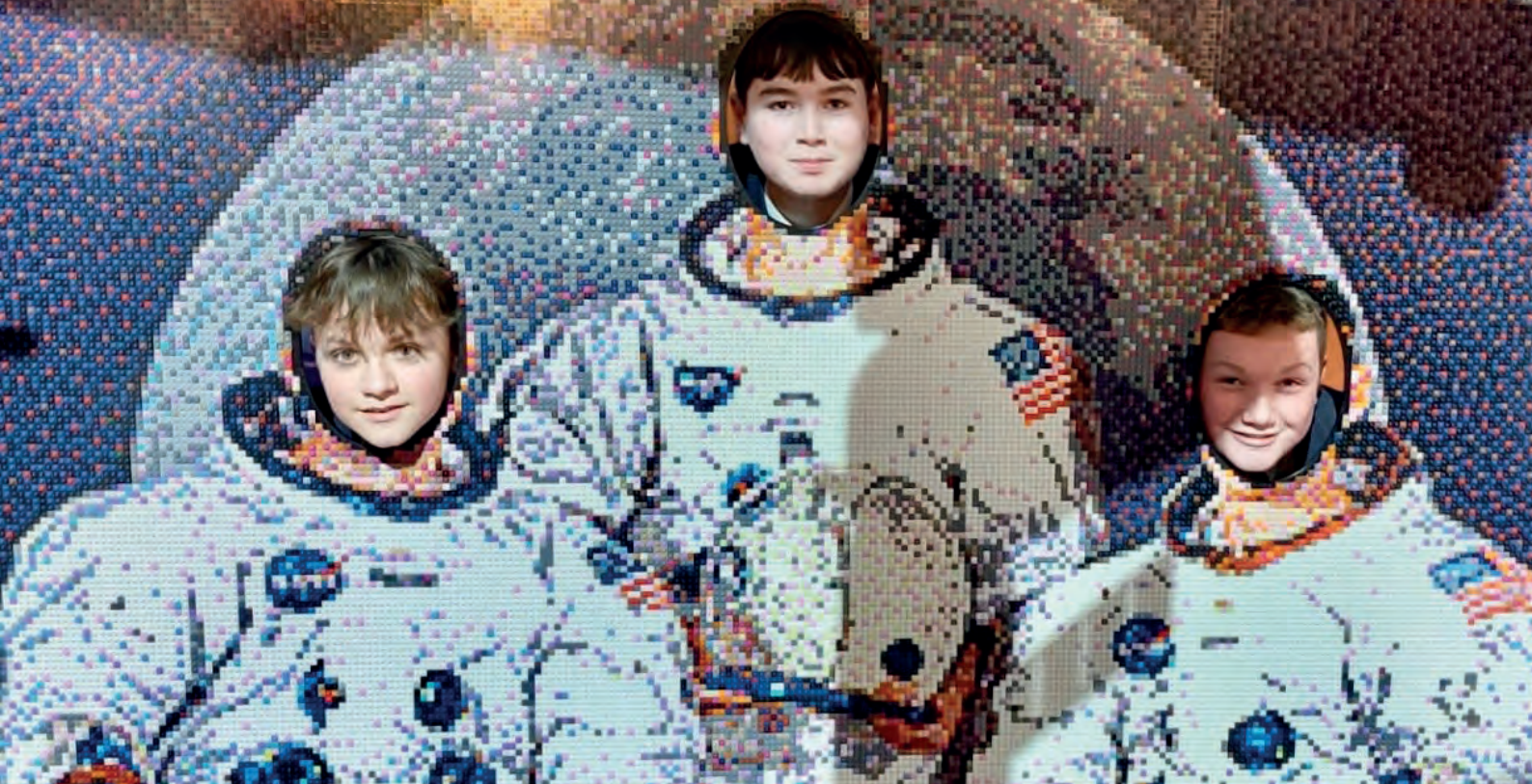
